Help us update the PEP

Calling all designated teachers, social workers & foster carers!

Have your say on the PEP process: we are reviewing the Personal Education Plan (PEP) document as well as the wider PEP process and would very much appreciate your involvement in any changes that may come about. To this end, we will be contacting all DTs, social workers and Foster Carers of B&H CiC with a questionnaire. It will take less than 10 minutes to complete but could really make a difference to yours and the young people's experience.

Transition Support

- Please remember that for children who are previously in care and transferring from Year 6 to Year 7, their parents or carers will need to inform secondary schools of their care status and provide evidence (e.g. the permanency order); they will also need to agree to their primary school sharing this information (it is up to them of course whether they choose to do so).
- Parents and carers may assume schools already know their child's care status and this vital information may be missed, along
 with eligibility for a year of Pupil Premium Plus grant of £2530.
- We have an example letter that schools can send to parents/carers of all new starters in Year 7 inviting them to let the school know if their children are previously in care; schools may wish to include this in their transition packs/information sessions. Raising Aspirations Day: Wed 29 November 2023

As part of Raising Aspirations for Children and Young People in Care, we will be working with the University of Sussex to develop and deliver an informed and sustained programme of events aimed at children in care. Events will be held on the University of Sussex campus, where children can attend and experience student life and gain insight into how studying in higher education (HE) may differ from their school and college experiences. As well as content focused on pathways, there will be opportunities to experience different subject areas intended to demonstrate the range and scope of higher education study.

The first programme will include an introduction to higher education, including information on the support available in HE for care leavers, student life and a campus tour. This session is running on Wednesday 29th November 2023 and is open to young people in Year 7 – 13.

Art Competition & Exhibition

For the second year running, the Virtual School ran an art competition for children in care, children previously in care and care leavers up to age 25.

Being motivated by the success of last year's competition which culminated in several online exhibitions as well as in galleries such as the Phoenix Art Space and the Brighton i360, we decided to offer our young people the opportunity to do it all again this year.

In order to gain a better awareness of each young person's unique interests and passions, this year's theme asked young people to note down or photograph 'what inspires you?' and submit it alongside their work.

Choosing a winner from each keystage was tougher than ever; a huge and heartfelt thank you to all that took part and all that supported a young person to take part. Please hold onto that art work so that it can be exhibited in this year's exhibition titled 'Bright'n Inspired', which will take place starting Sat 16 to Sun 24 September 2023 at the <u>Liberation Art Gallery</u>, Brighton, and will be launched by the young artists who took part.

Competition Winners

Key Stage 1 winner: W.B (left) - 'My Cats'

They 'make me feel happy and safe' and 'make me calm'. These jelly prints were made one weekend in May when W visited the studio of her foster mum's mum in the countryside (she is an artist and has 3 cats). W cut them out and stuck them on the paper and made a happy background with sky and grass and rainbows. She hopes the picture makes you happy too!

Key Stage 2 joint winner: L.R (right)

L has created a futuristic intergalactic costume design for a full-size mannequin who stands over 6 foot tall. She took her inspiration from her love of Lady Gaga and glamorous fashion. She listened to a playlist of (clean) Lady Gaga songs and danced as she made the design. She is particularly inspired by Lady Gaga's outrageous style and sassyness.

The mannequin is carrying a handbag containing a crown adorned with images of some of the other glamorous and fierce women and outfits she is inspired by.



Key Stage 3 winner: F.G (right)

F created a triptych using mixed media (spray paint, posca pens, acrylic and stencils) on A1 paper. F has taken his inspiration from the artist Andreas Preis, as he really enjoys his style. He has also taken inspiration from his love of football, especially Liverpool FC his favourite team and the players Mo Salah, Virgil Van Dijk, and Trent Alexander-Arnold.

Key Stage 2 joint winner: J.T (left)


This wolf was inspired by research I did with Shaz (art club teacher). It took two days to make, I used a jigsaw, drill, hammer and glue gun. My friend loves wolves and that why I started to love them. I give £1 a week from my pocket money to a charity who want to bring wolves back to Britain. It's the biggest thing I've made and I don't know where we are going to keep it. I like the mirror eyes best. We got all the things to make the wolf from the pavement in Hollingdean and from Shabitat.











Competition Winners Cont'd

Key Stage 4 winner: J.T (left)

The Horse print has been made by J. At our school we have a horse called Dinky, pictured above. J has a special bond with this horse. He finds it therapeutic to spend time grooming him and leading him to trot and jump.

Group Winners: A, J, K and O (right)

We were inspired by encouraging collaboration between our learners on the Autistic spectrum. Therefore, we have created a single art piece - it is very large and measures nearly 2m x 2m. We were inspired by the Japanese artist Kiyoshi Yamashita as he also had learning needs. He created art by using torn paper and often used items, paper and material he found. We feel this links to sustainability so we challenged ourselves to create an art piece using only recycled materials. Kiyoshi Yamashita made wonderful scenes with fireworks and we wanted to incorporate this in our art. The fireworks were made by painting the blank side of recycling and then shredding it. The students did well gluing these coming from a circle, as can be seen in the photos. To finish the art we had in incorporate ourselves! So those with a keen eye for detail may spot the students on the beach gazing up at the fireworks.
